As a registered participant of WorkSource Oregon, you will have access to a variety of services and tools such as:

- ✓ Employment referrals

NOTE: To access training and support services through WorkSource Oregon, you may be asked to provide documents verifying your identification and eligibility to legally work in the U.S. Individuals assigned male at birth and born in the year 1960 or later are required by law to register for Selective Service. Documentation indicating registration will also be required for services and funding.

The Self-Employment Assistance Program helps eligible unemployed workers establish a business while receiving Unemployment Insurance benefits.
